### Forestburg Sesquicentennial

Mark your calendars for the 2<sup>nd</sup> weekend in *June*! Forestburg will be celebrating 150 years of being a town in Montague County. A street dance will start the celebration on Friday night, *June 8<sup>th</sup>*, with the crowning of a senior king and queen citizen of Forestburg. You may submit your vote online at our website, [www.forestburgtx.com](http://www.forestburgtx.com) or pick up a paper voting form at all businesses in Forestburg. A parade will run through the streets of town on Saturday, *June 9<sup>th</sup>*, and the Forestburg Volunteer Fire Department will serve fish and all the trimmings at noon in the Community Center. The afternoon is filled with games, a jam/jelly contest, a cobbler contest, a mustache/beard contest, a bank robbery reenactment, a fiddlers contest, an antique style show, an antique farm equipment display, and many more activities. We will recognize the oldest person, the farthest traveled, and the largest family group in attendance. A children's pet parade and a rodeo will top off festivities on Saturday night. On Sunday, *June 10<sup>th</sup>*, we're having a community gospel meeting at the rodeo grounds followed by a potluck lunch. The committee is requesting citizens to dress in 1857 fashions.

**Just for giggles...**

"The California State Department of Fish and Game is advising campers, hikers, hunters, fishermen and golfers to take extra precautions and keep alert for bears while in the Yosemite and Mammoth areas.

People are advised to wear noise-producing devices such as little bells on their clothing to alert, but not startle, bears unexpectedly. The department also advises carrying pepper spray in case of an encounter with a bear.

It is also a good idea to watch for fresh signs of bear activity and know the difference between black bear and grizzly bear droppings.

Black bear droppings are smaller and contain berries and possibly squirrel fur. Grizzly bear droppings have little bells in them and smell like pepper spray."
